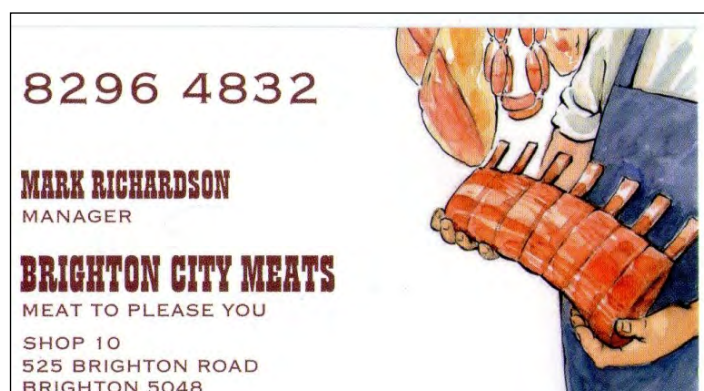

COMMODORE'S NOTES

Well that was one for the record books- for many wrong reasons! No one I have spoken to can remember a season where so many races were cancelled due to a lack of wind or, alternatively, way too much. At last count, we had 10 races abandoned out of a total of 23, not counting Sunday racing and junior training that the club may have had. When you consider that the club would normally take in between three to four thousand dollars in additional turnover on these days on average, you start to get an idea of the impact that has on us financially this year.

While that has been disappointing, it has not stopped our inevitable expenses. As I have previously mentioned, our utilities bills continue to rise way more than CPI (which our membership fee increases have pretty much been aligned to over recent times); our RIB's are showing their age (one in particular requiring pontoon replacements or a complete hull); we have a balcony deck structure that has had water infiltration and may require \$20k in repairs (hopefully Peter Gold, Malcom Larsen-Smith, Dave Webber & Bob Anesbury can keep that under control, they have been working tirelessly on it- thanks guys!); the balcony also has some significant concrete cancer that needs rectifying (\$6k); maintenance continues to rise on an aging building structure;

insurance premiums ever increase, and it goes on....

I am mentioning all this because I think it is important that our entire membership is aware of the challenges we face. I'll also add that this unfortunately comes on the back of spending most of our reserves on our Shedding Project (\$70k), and before that some unfunded liabilities (\$35k), so we are stretched thin at the moment. The Management Committee has devoted hundreds of hours each (and thousands of dollars supporting the club's turnover!) towards the betterment of the club and its services, yet at times this does not seem enough without more member support in some way.

What form this support should take is complicated. After meeting with the Youth Committee last month, they were all onboard with increasing their fees to cover more of the costs associated with training etc. (some parents mentioned their kid's soccer fees at \$800+ for reference). As our Senior Sailing Membership is at about 117 members, increasing fees a reasonable amount will only have a limited affect but I suspect that may have to happen as well, 10% maybe. Similarly, there are other possible initiatives that have been suggested such as a "house credit" (which is \$50-\$100 on your Club Rewards Card to be spent in the bar or galley, common in most other clubs). And

the pre-paying of the WB levy which is returned on completion of the member's obligation (currently chasing up members who sign the declaration and don't complete is ridiculous).

There is good news as well in case you were wondering! Firstly, if you have some thoughts on the above our AGM is on Friday the 29th June for you to come and voice them. Secondly, it is not too late to contribute and support in other ways, such as coming down for a meal, attending our Presentation Night (18th May) or Commodore's Ball (23rd June). And if you happen to have some money and are feeling altruistic or philanthropic, we welcome donations!

For the first time, our club is also heading for an annual turnover of over a million dollars this year, largely thanks to a big increase in the performance of our sailing school. This means more people being introduced to sailing, and new members (both junior and senior)

joining the club who are looking to support it. This turnover also indicates that there is scope to make more efficiencies commercially to help us become stronger overall, which we on the MC find very positive. With new enthusiasm on our House Committee injected by the "Canteen Queens", Julie Pike and Christie Davis (great effort this year girls!), I believe we have much to look forward to!

End of Season Celebration: With the weather once again being disagreeable for our last race of the year, this function could easily have been under attended. This was far from the case! A crowd of over 150 braved the cold, blustery conditions to make it down to the club to enjoy a fantastic night out and to support their club and committees that have contributed so much this year. Julie and Chris were once again outstanding coordinating the food for the evening (who doesn't love a good yiros!), whilst the "Rock Doctors" provided the perfect

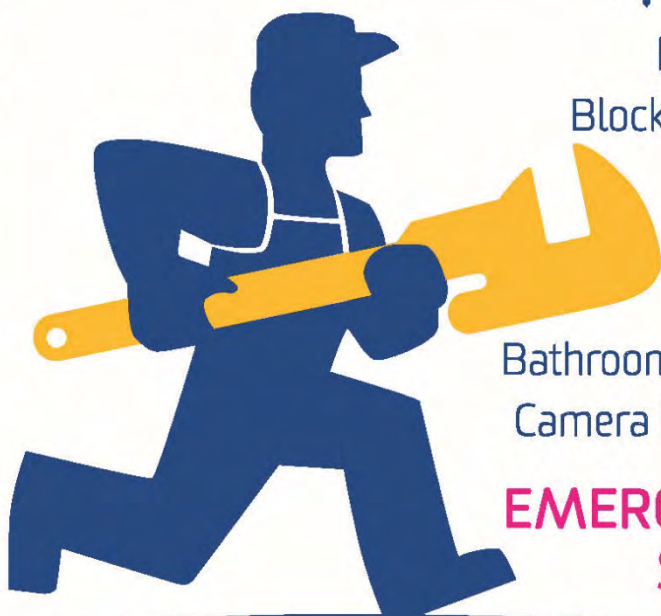

AUSTRALIAN SPORTS FOUNDATION

Update: April 2018

Members may recall that the Club formally re-established a fundraising partnership with the Australian Sports Foundation (ASF) back in mid-2016. At that time, we set up two fund-raising projects with ASF; the 'BSYC Club Infrastructure Project' and 'BSYC Junior and Youth Development Project'. The aims of these newly-established projects were to (i) capitalise on our unique location to improve the facilities and services provided by the club to our members and guests, and (ii) promote junior and youth sailing.

The ASF's status as a 'Deductible Gift Recipient' means that donations of \$2 or more are tax deductible. Across Australia, this incentive has resulted in a significant increase in fundraising for Australian sport, with total donations through the ASF increasing during the 2017 financial year to \$44.75 million - up from \$32 million the previous year. Some 19,000 donations were directed to over 2,300 sporting projects throughout the country. Overall, sailing was the

When deciding how best to spend the funds, it's important to note that the ASF keeps a close eye on all contributions, with a quarterly acquittal process ensuring expenditure on the nominated projects. The Management Committee carefully considers how best to allocate these funds to ensure that expenditure aligns with the aims of each project. The decision was made early last year to direct the funds available in the Infrastructure Project to the purchase six Pacer dinghies – the 'work-horses' of our learn-to-sail programs.

More recently, the Committee has allocated project funds to the purchase of much-needed new inflatable buoys, along with VHF radios and aerials for our junior fleet support boats. These have all been vital acquisitions that both underpin the Club's sail training and race activities, and ensure our on-water safety. Given the ongoing state of our finances, it is fair to say that, without the generosity of our club members, these important purchases would not have been possible.

Donations to the Club can be made anytime either online through the

ASF website (asf.org.au; follow the prompts under the 'Donate to Sport' menu, and search for BSYC) or offline by filling out a Donation Form available from the Club Office. The online option is preferred as it keeps office actions and costs to a minimum, and ensures a quick emailed delivery of the tax-deductible receipt.

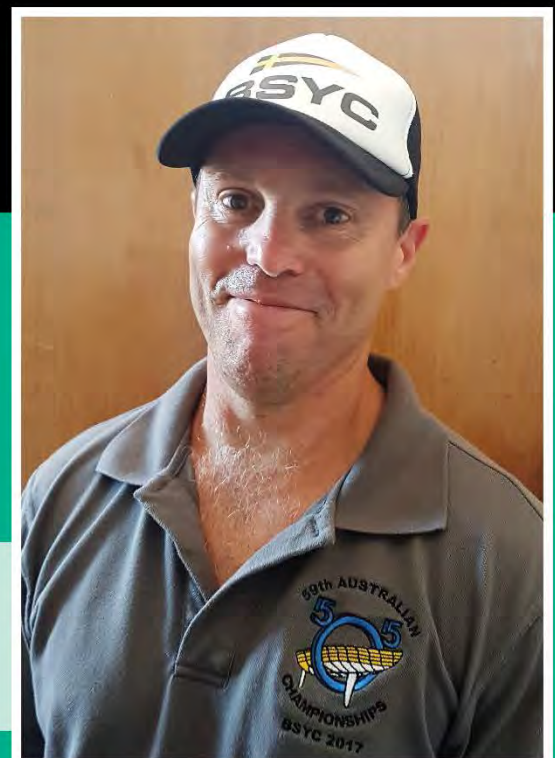

THE YACHT YOUTH CRUISING TROPHY



ENTRY FORM

THE TROPHY

The Yacht Youth Cruising Trophy is named after the cruising yacht *Youth* (originally built by and skippered in a remarkable 18 year global cruising marathon by Alan Quigley). It is open to adult members of any South Australian Yacht Club.

The Royal South Australian Yacht Squadron (RSAYS) is custodian of the Trophy.

AWARD TERMS OF REFERENCE

"The Trophy shall be awarded annually for personal achievement in cruising, with regard for seamanship, and which demonstrates personal endeavour and enterprise. A critical factor in assessing entries shall be the degree to which it is evident that the experience has not simply increased the skills of the entrant, but has significantly changed the entrant's view and perception of self (e.g. enhancing self confidence or self reliance, or increased self awareness of some propensity of character) to the enrichment of the entrant's future capacity for experiencing his/her life"

From Erik Mack's original deed establishing the Youth Trophy, 1987.

ASSESSMENT CRITERIA

Magnitude of achievement in terms of:

- personal endeavour and enterprise
- enhanced perception of self (see above AWARD TERMS)
- enrichment of capacity for experiencing life.

Adequacy of preparations for cruise of:

- the vessel
- the skipper and crew.
