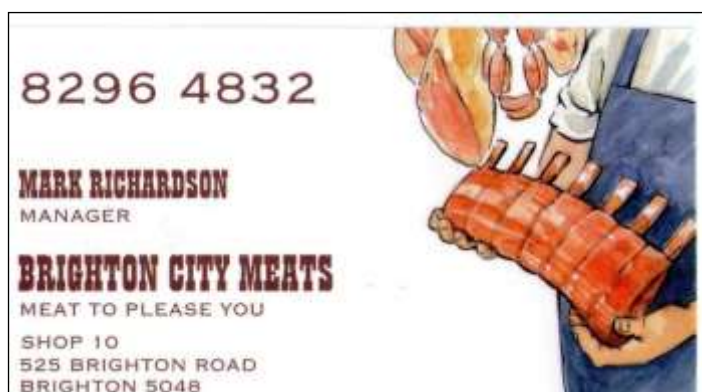

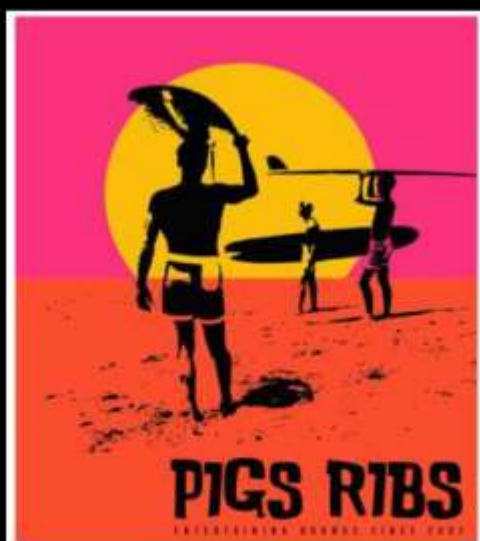

VICE COMMODORE'S REPORT

My theory of no wind on opening day = wind during the season seems to be working (touch wood).

We have had some really nice sailing days so far and have packed a lot into the first few weeks of the season.

Our best weekend being the weekend of the 9, 10 and 11 of November where we had boats out on the water on Friday night for the Fred Neil, the Saturday we had 85 boats on the water both junior and senior with interstate Contenders and 505's, we followed up on the Sunday with good size fleets of Contenders and 505's doing their state heats and Sharpies in full training for their Nationals. Great work happened on Seacliff 4 to start and finish everyone. Added to that 35 kids having a go in a Sharpie for National kids in Sharpies weekend.

We were back on the water on Sunday 18th November for the Sabre State Heats with 21 starters and a slightly fluctuating breeze, two good races were had by the fleet. We appreciated the positive feedback.

Tri Series on the 24th & 25th of November was a great success, last year we had 138 competitors and This year we had 82 comprising of 14 Intermediate Optis, 9 Lasers, 12 Cadets, 10 420's, 15 Opti Open, 15 Opti Green and 7 Bic, Brett and Roz have done an amazing job in rostering volunteers of various knowledge levels across all sections of the weekend. The Saturday had "Light and Fluffy" weather conditions across most points of the compass. A very challenging day on the Alpha course for PRO Marcus, for me on the green fleet with Anthony Roe, We were creative in our courses and managed to get 5 races in for the day.

The Sunday was a lighter breeze in the morning – the green fleet finished off their series and then had their medal presentations.

The afternoon sea breeze kicked in and the green fleet course was asked to look after the intermediate Opti's they wanted to sail in the wind but not out on the big course. The Opti Green course turned into the Opti Intermediate course -our start boat - Roz and Damon's tinny with a call sign of "Sayers Tinny" swung into action with Damon on sound signals and a new (Professional) crew member Brett on flags. Brett was very helpful when the Sayers Tinny (which usually tows

wakeboarders) was starting to drag the anchor, an additional one was gathered from S8 to keep us in place. A couple of quick races and the Intermediate series was complete and everyone was headed back to shore. We all learnt a lot had a lot of laughs and saw the juniors do some very impressive starts.

Thanks to everyone for volunteering – it does take a lot of help to get these events off the ground and keep things ticking along during the event.

The NS14's have had 2 mornings so far where they have taken people out for a sail, this been very successful and hopefully will result in a growth of their fleet – there are NS's for sale on the website – check them out! They are working on the next date so keep an eye on the log book.

We also have a couple of Bytes for sale on the website – or talk to Emma Short, if you want to see one in action - check out the one Andrew Sant is sailing! The club Laser has become available again and Brooke Jones has already had a practice sail in her.

Patsy and Brett have done some work with Adrian on updating the website and the old information has been updated. Snow has been taking some great photos out on Seacliff 1 and a gallery will be on the website for everyone to look for their action shots. Seacliff 8 has had new pontoons fitted and is looking like brand new – it is great to have her back in the fleet and on the water.

We are slowly gaining the upper hand on the data base and scoring issues we

have had, and I will work with Emma Short over the winter with Brett and Patsy to set up electronic registrations which should provide us with a better starting point. Thanks heaps to Annabel who has been doing the scoring for the last few weeks whilst Don has been away. We look forward to her in the bridge a bit more next season.

Another great Sailing school program is the Adult learn to sail with either the Start Sailing for beginners and follow on with the Better Sailing for the more experienced learners. Keep an eye on the website and around the club for this popular program.

Brett and I are also working on a Club 420 youth squad course – keep an eye out for details of this exciting new initiative.

There is also the option for Private lessons for singles, couples, families. Twilight sailing starts on Wednesday 5th December – a really fun night for any level of sailor and even for those who want to sail their own boats.

Plenty of opportunities for sailing at the 'Club of the Year', especially on the back of our fantastic segment on SA Weekender – what great interviews from the Piro boys, Lilly and especially Brett

SABRE DINGHY NEWS

Around The Club

STATE HEATS: The first two State heats were sailed at the Largs Bay Sailing Club on Sunday 28th October with 19 Sabres nominating for the days sailing. The races were short course, consisting of triangle/loop/windward finish and the prevailing 10-12 knot seabreezes were ideal. Seven Brighton Sabres made the trip north and they finished as follows in the two races:

The racing was closely contested in both races and in the second heat the margin between first and fifth at the finish was just 13 seconds. Largs Bay's PRO Darryl Emery did a great job setting the courses and in general race management on the day, to ensure a good afternoons racing was had by all competitors.

GOOLWA WINNER: Ron Rickards, our fleet delegate, is one of the Brighton

Sabres who regularly sails on Sundays in the Sabre fleet at the Goolwa Aquatic Centre. On the 4 November Round 1 of the Club Championship he put in a real blinder by taking out line honours in both of the races held, in what was a very hot fleet. After the racing finished a few of the beaten skippers were heard asking Noeline what Ronny had had for breakfast that morning, or perhaps more relevantly, what he had been drinking the night before!

CLOSE FINISH: Good to see that two of the newer skippers this season in the Sabre fleet in Jason Young, sailing Rat Bones, and James Veale, sailing Gert Lush, are improving each week as they come to grips with the peculiarities of campaigning a Sabre. Both have sailed in most of the races this season and in the recent second club heat Jason (13th) and James (15th) finished the race within 2 seconds of each other. James has recently been using a new Cliffo sail and he reckons that this has really made a noticeable difference to his boat speed and has also made the boat feel much more responsive for him to sail.

Club Racing

1st Club Heat 20/10: The weather forecast was ideal for the first club heat of the sailing season, with a 10-15 knot SW seabreeze predicted for the race and a good fleet of 17 Sabres lined up on the start line. For the second Saturday in a row Don Wilson sailing Wave Rider top scored in the the Consistency placings - maybe he's now looking for for the hat-trick!

Buttons (Peter Leader) won the Club Heat however David Gordon in Smoke & Mirrors kept the pressure on him while circulating in second spot for most of the race. As the race developed Graeme McLeay sailing with good boat speed in Felix got though to jag second across the line, while Dean Francis (Tiger) and John Gratton (Hoodoo) had a good scrap in the final stages of the race, with Tiger prevailing by 5 seconds at the finish - still reckon it was a draw across the line Dean!
