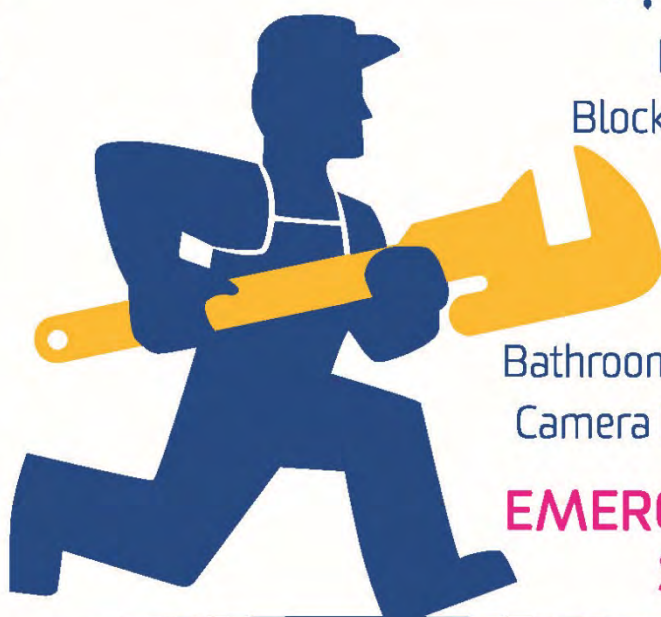
Club Racing:

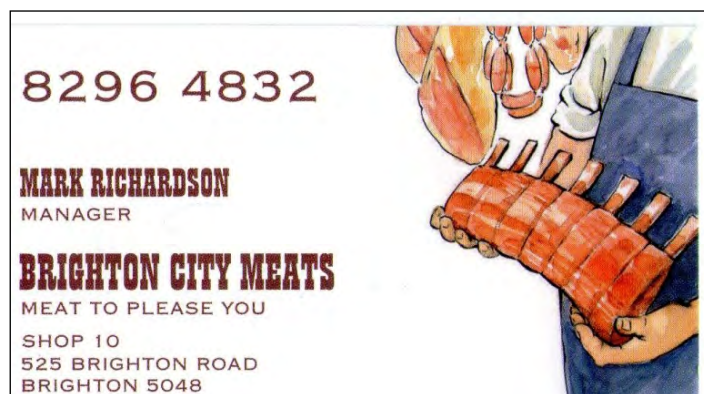

CONTROVERSY OVER TOPLESS BATHERS

Special Meeting of Glenelg Council

HENLEY TO CALL CONFERENCE

"Calling Mr. Fisk's Bluff"

A special meeting of the Glenelg Council Trill be held tonight to "deal with publicity given to a section of the press by the Mayor of Glenelg" on the question of topless bathers. The meeting has been requisitioned by nine members of the council.

On the suggestion of his council, the Mayor of Henley and Grange (Mr. V. Harvey) agreed last night to call a conference of seaside councils early in the new year to discuss the question of topless bathers.

Alderman C. Chambers said that he would like the mayor to take the initiative in arranging a conference of seaside councils to call the bluff of the Mayor of Glenelg (Mr. W. Fisk) Because Mr. Pisk had stated that he was in favour of topless bathers people got the impression that they could wear topless bathers at Glenelg, with the result that several men had

been prosecuted. As mayor of the leading seaside resort. Mr. Fisk should call the conference, but although he talked a lot he would not do so.

The names of two men, who were wearing shorts, with their chests uncovered, were taken by the Seacliff police on the beach at Seacliff. The name of another man was also taken for having worn topless bathers.

It was stated that when the police questioned the two men in shorts, they said that as the Brighton Council had decided not to prosecute two others whose names had been taken for having worn shorts, they assumed that they were not committing an offence against the council's by-law.

It is understood that both men are members of the Brighton and Seacliff Yacht Club. Their names were taken while they were walking along the beach towards the yacht clubhouse.

The police will prepare a report for the council, which will later submit the matter to its solicitor. It is understood that if the council is advised not to prosecute, it will take steps to revise the bathing by-law so that it will be an offence to wear shorts.
