## CLUB BY LAWS

- (1) Only members and visitors over the age of 18 years will be served with liquor. Furthermore, no person under 18 years of age is allowed to serve behind a bar.
- (2) No member or visitor is allowed on the upper deck unless dressed suitably. Minimum requirements are: dry shirt, shorts and footwear. Tank tops are not permitted.
- (3) Parking of motor vehicles is not permitted on club grounds.
- (4) Parents are responsible for the care of their children on the club premises, particularly on the upper deck.
- (5) Dogs are not permitted in the Clubhouse and must be on a leash whilst in the club grounds.
- (6) No member shall sail from the club premises at any time without an appropriate life jacket in accordance with Australian Sailing Racing Rules of Sailing Part1 Fundamental Rules Regulation 1.2. The Club recommends all members **Level 50N** Life Jacket at all times while sailing. Members are warned to take special care when sailing in an offshore breeze on non-race days when rescue craft are not available.
- (7) On Club sailing days, motor vehicles shall not be driven through the club grounds between 10 am and 7 pm.
- (8) Liquor purchased from the Club must be consumed on the club premises.

- (9) Boats should not be left on any of the club grounds except at weekends unless written permission is given.
- (10) Rear Lawn (in the interests of a healthy lawn)
- a) Sailing Craft with trailers, trolleys or jinkers are not permitted to use the rear lawn for any and all rigging and wash down other than as part of racing and regatta events.
- (11) Power boats, tractors, and other vehicles are not permitted on the rear lawn at any time.  
Front Lawn - Boats or sails should not be washed or dried on the lawns between the Clubhouse and the front stone wall, on race and regatta days, or whilst the lower deck bar or coffee cart are open. The lawn is to be kept clear for seating.
- (12) Further to the eligibility criteria within the Constitution for election and/ or appointment to Flag Officer positions (Commodore, Vice Commodore and Rear Commodore) nominees shall have been Full Members of BSYC of not less than three continuous years.

## **CLUB ETIQUETTE**

- (1) Trailer yachts are asked to rig, launch, retrieve or moor north of the public ramp on Club race days; dinghies to the south of the public ramp.
- (2) The Club barbecue should be cleaned after use.
- (3) Boats or trailers should not be left blocking access to boat sheds, roadways or ramps.

- (4) Whenever possible boats should be rigged on the beach. When boats are rigged in the Club grounds the road trailer and jinkers should not be separated. If they are, the road trailer should be parked on the beach as trailers are not permitted in the public car park.
- (5) On race days boats or sails should not be washed or dried on the lawns between the Clubhouse and the front stone wall.

## GUIDE TO BEING RESCUED

Don't delay too long before calling for assistance - it is very hard for the support craft personnel to right a capsized boat if the crew is too exhausted to help.

If you are in the boat raise both hands above your head and lower to sides at about five second intervals OR secure a shirt or rag to a spar and wave from side to side above head.

If the boat is capsized and you are in the water - raise one hand above the head for about three seconds at five second intervals. If it is necessary for a boat be towed ashore, the sails should be lowered quickly. The towline should be passed through a towing ring secured to the stem-head, wound around the mast once or twice & held securely within boat.

It is often better to sail the boat ashore, than to have it towed.

NOTE: Once assistance has been requested or agreed to, the powerboat skipper is in charge of the operation, and may, if he considers it necessary, anchor or abandon a yacht. The primary concern is to protect people; protecting equipment is important but secondary.

## **1. RULES**

1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing.

## **2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

2.1 The sailing instructions will be available online and will be on the notice board located on the Eastern wall of the Lower Deck and in the club program

## **3 COMMUNICATION**

3.1 The notice board is located on the eastern wall of the lower deck.

3.2 [DP] [while racing] [From the first warning signal until the end of the last race of the day], except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

3.3 Supplementary Sailing instructions and notices will also be placed on the notice board.

## **4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY**

4.1 The event is open to all financial sailing members of BSYC in monohull dinghy classes, windsurfers, keel boats and trailer sailors.

4.2 Eligible boats may enter by completing the entry form at <https://racing.bsyc.com.au/> before the first warning signal.

4.3 A non-financial member may join as a sail pass member for the day by completing the sail pass requirements at <https://www.revolutionise.com.au/bsyc/registration>

4.4 Visiting boats who are financial members of an Australian Sailing Affiliated Club shall enter on the sheet provided.

4.5 Visiting boats and non-financial helms are not eligible for points in club championship or club event scoring.

4.6 To be considered an entry in the event a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.

4.7 late entries will be accepted at the Race Committee Start Boat.

## **5 RACE FEES**

### **5.1 Club members with Sailing Rights.**

If the Bulk fee has been paid for the season (Senior Sailing with Race Fees & Junior Sailing) then no extra fee is required for Saturday sailing sessions.

### **5.2 Club members without sailing rights**

'Senior Sailing Members without Race fees' will need to pay per Saturday sailing session and the fees are: \$15 per senior member.

### **5.3 Non-Members**

Visitors who are not financial members of an Australian Sailing Affiliated Club can apply for a single day membership through Sailpass. This applies to Saturday and sailing events on any other day.

### **5.4 State Heats at BSYC**

Visiting boats/crews and state title contestants who are financial members of an Australian Sailing Affiliated Club. The fee per boat including crew for each morning and afternoon session is: Youth and

Senior classes \$15 per boat, Optimist and junior classes \$10 per boat. This fee may be covered by the class association and invoiced. On Saturday afternoons, BSYC boats that have paid a club fee will not pay an extra fee for state heat nominations, they will pay a fee on other days or for a Saturday AM session.

## **11 RISK STATEMENT**

RRS3 states: the responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone'. By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks including strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.

## **12 INSURANCES**

12.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$10mil per incident or the equivalent.

For the Trailer Sailor fleet the scoring yardstick class basic handicap as in the Australian Trailerable Yacht and Sports boats rule or as modified by the club.

#### **2. Consistency Series ©**

To be eligible for a club consistency trophy each class shall have at least 5 starters in any 7 races of the series. Once a class is eligible all races shall count.

When classes have state championships away from the club the race for that class will become a non-consistency race. (NC)

### 3. Trophy Races

Handicap races are awarded to the boat winning a race on handicap in a race with 4 or more starters.

### 4. Series Scoring

A boats series score shall be the total of her race scores. For a Series of up to 5 races, all races shall count towards a final score. For a series of 6 races the points from the worst race is excluded, for 7 to 9 races the worst 2 races are excluded, for 10 to 12 races the worst 3 races are excluded and for 13 or more the 4 worst races are excluded.

At the start of the sailing season all boats will sail their first consistency race off their ***handicap allocated for the final race of the previous season***. New boats will start from scratch and gain a handicap after completing 3 races. A class may vary this initial handicap only after application in writing to the sailing committee and approval by that committee.



# BSYC SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

## Season 2025 to 2026

The notation [NP] in a Rule of the sailing instruction (SIs) means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule.

### **1 Rules.**

1.1 The events are governed by The Racing rules of Sailing (RRS)

### **2 Changes to Sailing Instructions**

2.1 Any change to the Sailing Instructions will be posted not less than 1 hour before the Warning Signal of the first race it will affect.

### **3 Communications with Competitors**

3.1 Notices to competitors will be placed on the official notice board on the eastern wall of the lower deck.

3.2[DP] [While Racing] [From the first warning signal until the end of the last race of the day] except in an emergency, a boat shall not make or receive voice or data communications that is not available to all boats

3.3 ***When racing is abandoned after boats have commenced racing a spotlight maybe switched ON the bridge to call attention to the race signal for abandonment.***

### **4 Code of conduct**

[DP] Competitors and Support Persons shall comply with reasonable requests from race officials.

### **5 Signals made ashore.**

5.1 Signals made ashore will be on the flagpole on the Bridge.

5.2 When AP is displayed ashore, 1 minute is replaced with not less than 30 minutes in Race Signals, AP.

**6. Schedule of races.** See Clause 6 of Notice of Race

## **7 Class Flags**

7.1 Class flags will be displayed on the notice board at least 1 hour before the first the first race it will take effect.

## **8 Racing Area**

8.1. The racing area shall be the waters of Gulf of St Vincent off Seacliff.

## **9. Courses**

9.1 Course will be displayed on the Notice Board at least 1hour before the Warning Signal of the first race it will affect.

## **10. Marks**

10.1 Marks will be displayed with Course as in SI 9.1

## **11 The Start**

11.1 Races will be started using RRS26

11.2 The starting line is between a staff displaying an orange flag on the committee vessel at the starboard end and the course side of the port end starting mark.

11.3 Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area during the starting sequence for other races.

***11.4 A boat that fails to sign ON, on land may do so at any course boat excluding the committee boat up to its first warning signal. Failure to sign ON will be scored DNS.***

11.5 A boat that does not start within 4 minutes after her starting signal will be scored DNS without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.1 and A 5.2

## **12 Change the next leg of the course.**

12.1 To change the next leg of the course the race committee will lay the new mark (or move the finish line) and remove the original mark

as soon as practicable. When in a subsequent change a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced by the original mark.

### **13. General Recall**

13.1 When a general recall is signalled the recalled class shall then accept a later start as designated by display of its class warning signal. This changes RRS29.2.

### **14. The Finish**

14.1 The Finish Line for Offshore finishes is between staffs displaying Blue Flags on the finishing marks.

14.2 The finish line for onshore finishes is between a staff displaying a blue flag on the clubhouse and a mark displaying a blue flag. A mark displaying a white flag will be laid near the shore and close to the finish line. Boats shall not pass between this mark and the shore when finishing.

### **15. Penalty system.**

15.1 RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two – Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty

### **16. Time Limits.**

16.1 The time limit shall be 3hrs except that for Trailerable Yacht “Longshore Races” it shall be 3.5 Hrs

16.2 Finishing window. Boats failing to finish within 30 minutes of the finish of the first boat and not subsequently, retiring, penalised or given redress will be scored Time Limit Expired [TLE] without a hearing. A Boat scored TLE shall be scored points for the Finishing Place two more than the points scored by the last boat that finished within the Finishing Window. This changes RRS 34, A51, A5.2 and A10

**17. Hearing Requests** The protest time limit is 60 minutes after the last boat finishes in the last race of the day or the race committee signals no more racing today whichever is later.

**18. Arbitration.** Appendix T shall Apply.

## **19. Safety**

**19.1 A boat that fails to sign OFF prior to the nomination desk closing will be scored DNF.**

19.2 [DP] A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee at the first reasonable opportunity. [Promptly after returning to shore, the boat shall complete **an electronic sign off available at the nomination desk, in the lower deck.**

**20. Risk statement** RRS3 states: the responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone'. By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks including strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.



## DUTY CLASS ROSTERS

Members are rostered to carry out duties at the Club on a boat class basis, i.e. all members of a particular class are rostered on one week, all members of another class the next week, and so on. Some classes with smaller fleet sizes may be combined.

It is the responsibility of the maintenance officer or their delegate to allocate and publish duty rosters, and it is the responsibility of class delegates to ensure these duties are carried out.

Duty rosters will be published a month in advance in the club newsletter.

The following duties are always included in the duty roster:

- Remove sand from driveways.
- Collect glasses after sailing.
- Empty rubbish bins around Club into wheelie bins and dumpster.
- Run meat raffle after sailing.
- Sausage sizzle after sailing.
- Return taps to racks in cage near ladies' toilets.
- Lock all junior and senior sheds at 5pm.
- Other tasks as assigned by officers
